August has been a busy month for Officers from both our Safer Neighbourhood Team and Response Departments. PC Quinn was delighted to be able to show brothers Callum and Riley around Dereham Police Station where they got to see our virtual Court Room, Interview Rooms and of course our cars! They also dropped in on our Duty Sgts and said hello to officers who were in the Station at the time. When not carrying out engagement events our officers continue to proactively patrol our area and respond to emergency calls. You may have seen on Social Media that Officers from Team 5 have been praised for their quick response and life-saving actions when they responded to an emergency call of an elderly man who had collapsed in Lloyds Bank having had a cardiac arrest. The officers arrived on scene within 4 minutes along with an off-duty First Responder. Carrying out CPR and using a de-fibrillatory the team successfully managed to resuscitate the man who was then taken to hospital. We have been updated from Doctors at the NNUH that the man is making an "amazing" recovery. From all the Emergency Services we wish the gentleman a full and speedy recovery and we would also like to thank the members of the public who posted such supportive messages on our Facebook Page.

### Message from your Engagement Officer, Pc Paula Gilluley

We often talk about how busy Police are kept and so this month I thought you may be interested in some facts and figures for what we did in August this year. A total of **2069** Reports were generated from **870** emergency 999 calls, **919** non-emergency calls on the 101 number and **280** on line reports. Officers attended **1186** of these incidents. There were **93** RTC reports and **72** domestic reports. Officers made **103** arrests and recorded **574** crimes. These figures refer to the **Breckland Policing District** only and are accurate as of 3rd September.

Offence	Numbers	What This Could Entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary Residential	1	Residential Burglary will encompass entry to any building within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence, e.g. garden sheds and garages
Burglary Business and Community	0	Business and community Burglaries will include shops, businesses and other property. In general, the purpose for which a building is designed will determine whether it should be classified as 'Residential' or 'Business and Community'.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
